	Deaner	779 A.2d 578	6/28/2001	PA Super	Sentence	Treatment	Statute permitting transfer from a state correctional facility due to illness and the need for medical treatment only provides for transfer or sentence modification where the institution lacks the resources to properly care for an inmate, or where the inmate's removal is in the best interest of the institution as a whole. 61 P.S. 81.
	Morrow	650 A.2d 907	12/8/1994	PA Super	Sentence	Treatment	District Attorney not required to give reason for rejecting a candidate for treatment under 35 Pa CSA 780-118.
	Grosso	652 A.2d 407	8/1/1994	PA Super	Sentence	Treatment	Trial court lacks authority to transfer an inmate from a prison to an alternative institution for medical care since adequate care was available in prison (61 PS 81).
