Introduction to Sentencing in Pennsylvania

Course Description

This seminar will cover basic terminology used in the field and provide an overview of statutes and policies related to sentencing (sentencing alternatives, mandatory minimums, county vs. state sentences, aggregation, merger, etc.).

Target Audience

This seminar targets attorneys, probation officers, law clerks, support staff, and other court-related staff who are new to the criminal justice system and have little or no experience with criminal justice concepts, terminology, and sentencing practices.

There will be a review of statutes related to sentencing. It will also include an overview of some of the recently enacted legislation regarding sentencing and corrections.
