6th Edition (and Revised) Sentencing Guidelines and Sentencing in Pennsylvania

Course Description

This seminar will provide a comprehensive explanation of Offense Gravity Score, Prior Record Score, and sentence recommendations specific to the 6th Edition Sentencing Guidelines and the 6th Edition, Revised Sentencing Guidelines. There will be an overview of statutes related to sentencing (CIP, SIP, credit, mandatory minimums, etc). It will also include updates to statutes regarding sentencing and corrections (RRRI, county parole/county reentry, aggregation, place of confinement, etc).

Target Audience

This seminar targets individuals who will be required to calculate the 6th Edition (and Revised) Sentencing Guidelines as part of their job or individuals who need to become more familiar with and have an understanding of general sentencing policies and the guidelines. This session can serve as a review for someone who has not taken a sentencing training session recently.
